

### **Chewing Gum**

We have seen an increase in students having chewing gum in school. Please can parents and carers support school in reminding your child that chewing gum is not permitted in school. We encourage students to take pride in our building.

### **MMR Immunisations**

You may be aware we have cases of measles in Greater Manchester, these numbers are increasing. Measles can be a very serious disease, leading to ear and chest infections, fits, diarrhoea, and damage to the brain. Measles can kill. Achieving high levels of immunity against vaccine preventable diseases is vital to reduce the spread of infection and prevent outbreaks. High levels of immunity can result in herd immunity, whereby the protection from immunisation programmes extends to individuals who cannot be vaccinated for a number of reasons.

As part of the control measures, initiated by GM health protection, the NHS Immunisation Team are offering vaccinations to students who have a 'nil' or 'incomplete' MMR vaccination status. Consent forms have

gone out to identified students this week. The Immunisation team will be coming to school on **Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup> March 24** to administer students for whom consent has been received.

Year 11 - The Apprenticeship Team at Tameside College will be running screening sessions to assess any students who have applied for an apprenticeship on the dates below. These screening sessions are a crucial part of the process for Apprenticeships so the college can evaluate students' credentials and ethics before shortlisting CVs for partner employers. If students do not attend one of these sessions, they will not be shortlisted:

#### Year 10 Work Experience

We have had some enquiries regarding the arrangements for work experience recently. The policy and procedure for applying for work experience is available on the school website via the <u>Personal</u> <u>Development</u> section. In summary, all students in year 10 can apply for work experience, but it is their responsibility to source a suitable placement. The school will then assist by ensuring that a risk assessment takes place and that the employer has up to date employer's liability insurance. In addition to this, year 10 students can also apply to participate in a workplace safari which is a visit to a workplace linked to the students careers aspirations, again details of these visits are available on the school website.
